

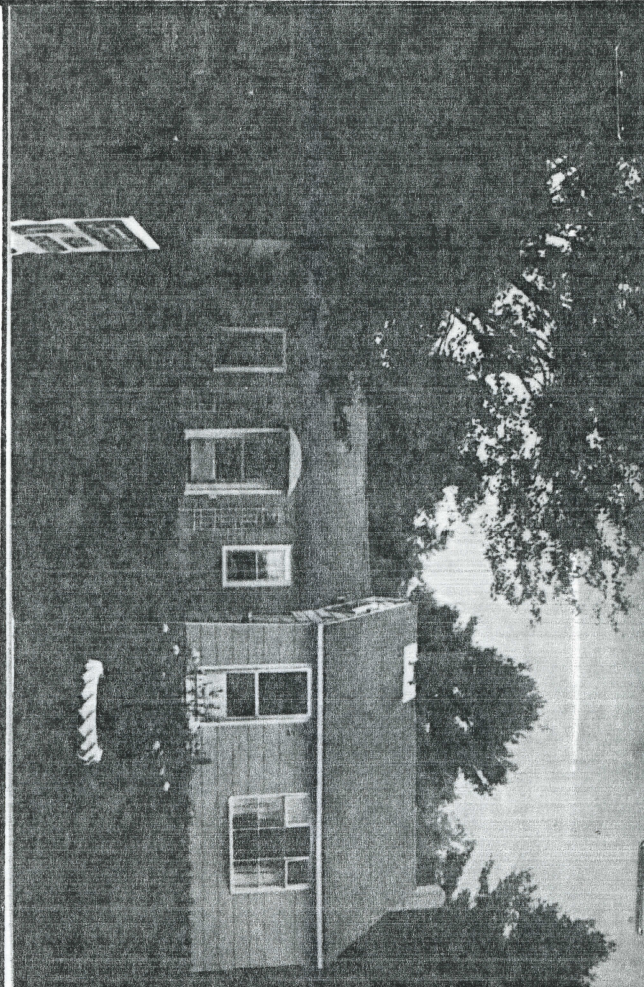

This tiny 1/2 Cape was the home of the Bartlett family in the last half of the 19th Century, but built considerably earlier, possibly by the Dustin family. The road was named after this family. 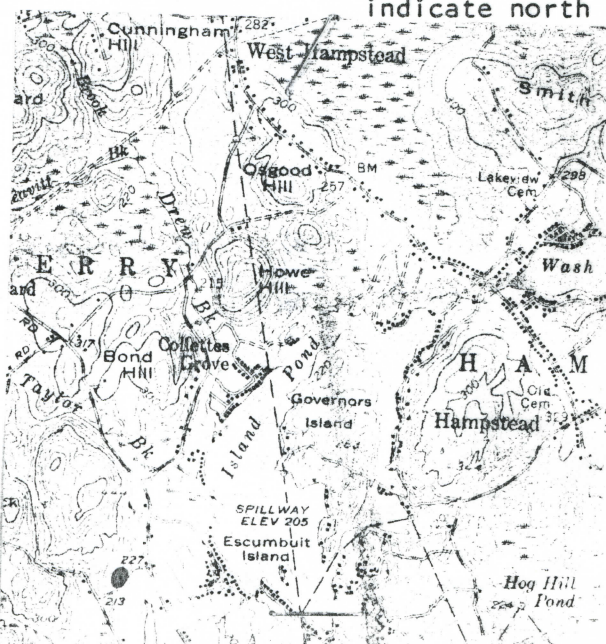
