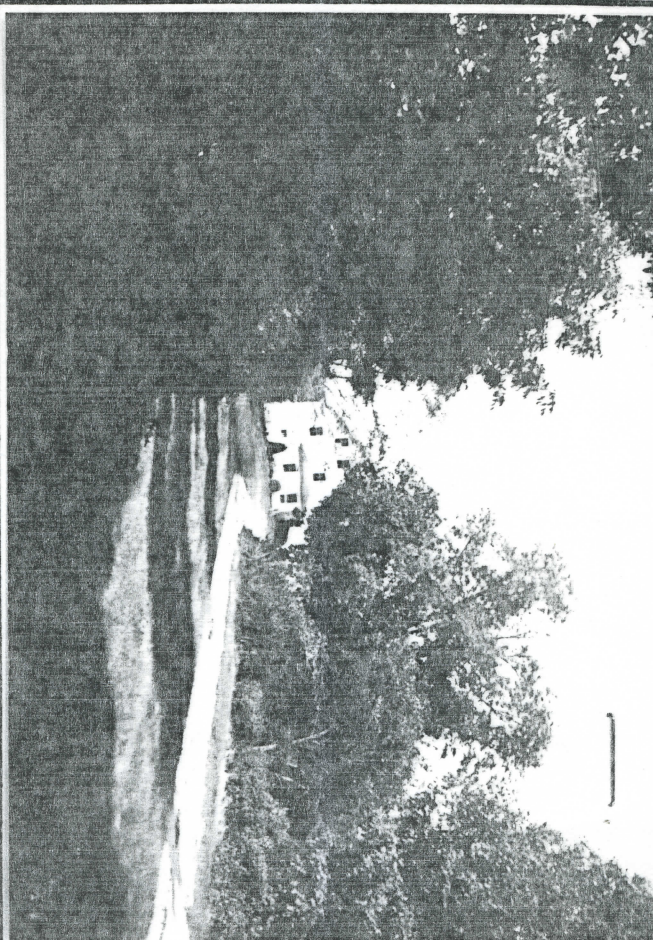

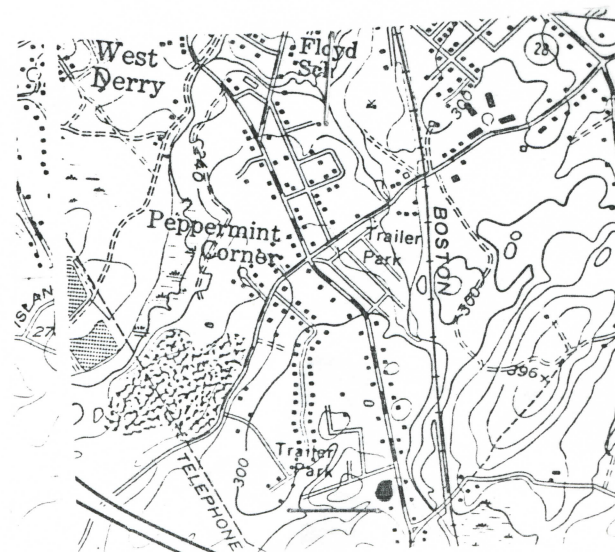

and full transom. The sash was replaced in the late 19th Century by 2/2 sash. Some of the extensive out buildings still exist. The old photographs show a treelined drive with orchards and stoned walls, a picket fence and a picture of Deacon Joseph Montgomery with an extraordinary pair of black horses hitched to his carriage. The site is the last left on the Fordway Extension towards the border of Derry.
